Dr. David Alspaugh was honored by his induction into the Geospatial Intelligence Hall of Fame Class of 2017 on October 3, 2017.

In Dave's opinion, his work represents that of many dedicated employees within NGA and its predecessor organizations in St. Louis who over the years worked with him and supported him in developing photogrammetric technology. It was a group effort, and he thanks them.

Dave's family was able to celebrate with him at the ceremony in St. Louis and to join in the simultaneous video ceremony at NGA headquarters.

The following is from Dave's citation.

David Alspaugh, Ph.D., served as a physical scientist for NGA's predecessor agencies, the United States Air Force Aeronautical Chart and Information Center and Defense Mapping Agency Aerospace Center, and played a leading supervisory and hands-on role in the development and continuing improvement of the methodology and complex instrumentation used to exploit satellite imagery.

Lighthouse Keeper for a Week --Paulette Martin


In October six of us, including another NGA retiree, Betty (Eiler) Rose (pictured), headed to the town of Sequim,

The NGAA West Board of Directors wants to thank you for your patience as Kay Strebeck and I transition to back up Bob Eddy as treasurer. It was and continues to be a learning experience. Bob's record keeping in Excel far exceeds my ability and understanding of the nuances he built into his system. The good news is that our balances are correct and have increased, thanks to your and our new members' continued commitment.

Currently, the Treasurer expects that expenses will exceed income from events by \$2000. This year the \$2000 is balanced by approximately 90 Annual and one-tenth of 115 Lifetime members paying \$10 dues. The current funds could support about ten years of future activity without changes in the cost profile or any increased enrollment. But life is not static, and we do not expect NGAA West to remain unchanged.
